Many teachers assume that it is part of their job to teach students how to share, cooperate and avoid aggressive behaviour, to instil the right ideas, because these things don't happen naturally. Thus school becomes one of the most powerful socializing influences a child encounters. Actually, the process of socialization begins much earlier than school. Children receive a fair amount of information through situations that begin even before their first birthday; they are warned, threatened, punished, ordered and forbidden. By around four years of age, children

are expected to comply with a range of requests or demands, related to safety, respect for possessions, respect for others, family norms and social norms. When they are six years old, they begin formal schooling, and most Indian schools devote time to educating their young in manners and morals. Such moral lessons are imparted regularly, perhaps weekly, right through the school years.
